North Korea is not “Insane”

IT HAS NEGOTIATED/CURTAILED NUCLEAR BUILDUP IN THE PAST

1. North Korea engaged in ongoing negotiations and significantly curbed its nuclear program before President George W. Bush labeled it part of the “Axis of Evil,” then scrapped a nuclear agreement negotiated by Clinton administration.*
2. Negotiations should be initiated by suspension of joint US/South Korean military exercises in exchange for a pause in North Korea nuclear/misile testing, a “freeze-for-a-freeze” for which there is precedent.**

3. U.S. must realize North Korea fears for its security because U.S.:
 - Unrelenting bombing destroyed most North Korean cities and villages during 1950s Korean War.
 - Has refused to conclude Korean War peace treaty or recognize North Korea's sovereignty.
 - Continues threats, intimidation and economic sanctions aimed at North Korea..
 - Forced regime-change in other nations.
 - Continues massive, provocative US/South Korea military exercises.
4. International experts agree North Korea's nuclear weapons program is defensive deterrent, not a first-strike threat.

5. Past and present sanctions are ineffective. In spite of these North Korea has improved its economy.
